Apart from Ganga's interactive musical performance students will also enjoy learning about the history of the didgeridoo & its making, other traditional musical instruments, hunting tools, and more!

DIDGERIDOO & DANCE PERFORMANCE

This assembly concert is a great way to celebrate a special occasion by connecting the whole school with Aboriginal community!



THE EXPERIENCE

This assembly concert starts with setting the mood with an acknowledgement of Country, followed by Barama presenting interactive storytelling & dance, accompanied by the mystical sound of the didgeridoo as played by Ganga Giri.

Ganga will introduce the didgeridoo and gradually take the students on a musical, tribal didgeridoo and beats dance frenzy. A great concert with plenty of audience participation - the students enjoy learning rhythm and dance and celebrating multi-cultural Australia in the now.

Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Histories & Cultures cross-curriculum priorities: COUNTRY/PLACE: OI.1

WE SUPPLY

Amplification and microphones, two performers including an Aboriginal dancer and world-renown didgeridoo virtuoso Ganga Giri.

WE NEED

Enough space for all students to get up and dancing!

WHOLE SCHOOL PROGRAM

With larger group sizes and a range of topics, this rich experiential learning opportunity will engage all students, moving and creating!

THE EXPERIENCE

This multi program/educator rotational session program is tailored to your school. Priced per head this is great value and will get everyone involved. A 20 mins assembly-type Introduction starts the program, followed by concurrent rotational activities for larger cohorts of up to 150 students. Three or four different activities can be arranged for each cohort, with groups moving to the next activity every 45 mins. (1/2 to Full day experience)



Class-sized Year Level Programs





ABORIGINAL CULTURE

Highly engaging and resource-rich, this interactive 'show-and-tell' program is a great introduction to Aboriginal culture!



THE EXPERIENCE

A comprehensive presentation and discussion of traditional cultural activities and their interrelation with seasonal changes in the natural environment. Our educator will showcase a large range of authentic Aboriginal artifacts relating to hunting, music, arts and crafts. Throughout the session several objects (boomerangs, animal skins, possum skin game ball, emu eggs, baskets and more) will be passed to the students for that memorable, hands-on experience.

With live didgeridoo music joined by the students playing clap sticks and a demonstration of how to make Aboriginal paint.

Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Histories & Cultures cross-curriculum priorities: COUNTRY/PLACE: OI.1, OI.2, OI.3. CULTURE: OI.4, OI.5, OI.6 PEOPLE: OI.7, OI.8 & OI.9.

WE SUPPLY

A wide range of authentic Aboriginal artifacts, large pull up banners with images and sanitised practice instruments for each student.

WE NEED

Sufficient floor space for all students to sit in a semi-circle. Name tags for the students, if possible.

Song, Dance & Storytelling

Children learn an Aboriginal and a Torres Strait Islander song, traditional dance moves and creation stories from a First Nation educator.



THE EXPERIENCE

Barama will teach children to sing an Aboriginal and a Torres Strait Islander song and explain the lyrics and what the songs are about. This is followed by learning about traditional dance where children get to practice some traditional dance moves, including imitations of native animals.

Students learn about the world view of Aboriginal people and their deep connection to all living beings and to country through Barama's storytelling. Inclusion of an interactive Dreamtime story telling session with students. A range of authentic cultural objects are also presented during this experience.

One educator, cultural objects, pull up banners.

WE NEED

Sufficient floor space for all students to dance.

DIDGERIDOO AND BEATS

A great program if you want to get the students dancing and being part of a live music performance with traditional Aboriginal instruments!



THE EXPERIENCE

A highly interactive live music/dance experience for the students, conducted by a master didgeridoo player, who has toured internationally for over 20 years and has played on some of the largest festival stages in the world.

Our performer will introduce simple rhythm patterns with body percussion and clap sticks, creating an interactive 'band' with all students joining in. After adding some Aboriginal dance moves, he will gradually raise the energy of the performance, joining the band with his didgeridoo and introducing electronic beats. It will most likely end up in a high-energy dance party!

WE SUPPLY

Clap sticks for students, amplification, didgeridoos and electronic beats.

WE NEED

Sufficient floor space for students to dance.

YIDAKI

A fun-filled and comprehensive presentation for all students, showcasing a musical instrument unique to Aboriginal culture: the didgeridoo!



THE EXPERIENCE

Globally recognised as the musical instrument that produces 'the sound of Australia', the didgeridoo has long been a traditional musical instrument in the Top End. Its place of origin is North East Arnhem Land, where it is called yidaki. After introducing the yidaki with a live demonstration, our educator will take your students on a virtual journey to Arnhem Land, to witness the crafting of the instrument by its traditional owners and its use during ceremony.

Whilst learning about the cultural significance of this fascinating instrument students will also learn about its global popularity and have plenty of opportunity to ask questions. Please note: this program is not gender-specific.

Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Histories & Cultures cross-curriculum priorities: CULTURE: OI.5

WE SUPPLY

A range of authentic yidaki, large pull up banners, media files for ICT presentation and question sheets for the students.

WE NEED

ICT facility and suitable venue for the audience size (eg. classroom or auditorium). Microphone and amplification for larger venues / group sizes.

Fee: \$550 + GST (per class, max. 50 minutes)









ULTIMATE BOOMERANG GAMES

This is an introduction of students to throwing non-returning hunting boomerangs and returning boomerangs.



THE EXPERIENCE

A short introduction of different boomerang types is followed by a safety briefing and a demonstration on how to throw a hunting boomerang at a target. Under active supervision students will engage in throwing practice. Two groups are formed for a fun competition to find out which team has the best aim and scores the most points. They will also learn to throw returning boomerangs.*

Students discover first-hand how highly advanced, exciting and empowering ancient Aboriginal technology really can be!

Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Histories & Cultures cross-curriculum priorities: COUNTRY/PLACE: OI.2, OI.3 CULTURE: OI.5, OI.6 PEOPLE: OI.9

WE SUPPLY

High-quality, hand-crafted hunting boomerangs, targets and position markers.

WE NEED

An oval and one teacher to assist with the supervision of the students.

*(returning boomerangs: weather permitting)

Fee: \$550 + GST (per class, max. 50 minutes)









INDIGENOUS GAMES

Students explore and enjoy indigenous culture through sport-related activities based on traditional games!



THE EXPERIENCE

Students will learn about the significance and diversity of traditional games played by indigenous people across Australia and the Torres Strait islands.

Our educator will then introduce a number of games, including Marngrook (an Aboriginal ball game similar to footy), explain the rules and lead the activity. A fun, all-inclusive and structured activity to explore different types of skill games suitable for all age groups.

Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Histories & Cultures cross-curriculum priorities: COUNTRY/PLACE: OI.2, OI.3, CULTURE: OI.5, OI.6 PEOPLE: OI.9.

WE SUPPLY

All sports equipment needed for the games.

WE NEED

An oval or sports hall and one teacher to assist with the supervision of the students.








ABORIGINAL ART

This experience is very hands-on: every student engages in an activity of making traditional Aboriginal paint and painting their own boomerang.



THE EXPERIENCE

In the absence of written languages, Aboriginal people used paintings to convey knowledge for thousands of years. Art styles vary greatly across Australia.

In this program, students get introduced to a number of Aboriginal symbols and how they can be used to tell a story, Students learn how to make their own traditional paint (with ochre, clay and charcoal) and paint a wooden boomerang, using traditional patterns and symbols, to take home at the end of the day.

Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Histories & Cultures cross-curriculum priorities: COUNTRY/PLACE: OI.3 CULTURE: OI.5

WE SUPPLY

Wooden boomerangs, brushes, ochres and grinding rocks, large banners illustrating Aboriginal symbols and acrylic spray to seal the finished artwork.

WE NEED

Tables and chairs set up for 4-6 students per table. Easy access to a sink to clean resources between the sessions (allow 30 minutes between classes).

Fee: \$650 + GST (per class, max. 50 minutes)









BUNJIL & WAA

A collaborative art project to create large murals based on two significant local creation ancestors, using traditional symbols.



THE EXPERIENCE

In this program students learn the stories of Bunjil and Waa, get introduced to a number of Aboriginal symbols and patterns, learn about traditional paint (made with ochre, clay and charcoal), traditional bark painting, and working collaboratively on either creating a large format Eagle or Crow mural. The finished product makes for a great banner display for your school! (Approx. 1 single mural per 10 students or 1 double mural per 20 students)

Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Histories & Cultures cross-curriculum priorities: COUNTRY/PLACE: OI.3 CULTURE: OI.5 PEOPLE: OI.8

WE SUPPLY

Pre-prepared "Bark Painting" support (craft paper with gesso and an outline of a bird), brushes, paints/pens & large banners illustrating Aboriginal symbols.

WE NEED

Adequate floor space space for participants to gather around the mural and easy access to a sink to clean the resources. Each mural is up to 4.5m long.

Fee: \$550 + GST (per class, max. 50 minutes)











FIBRE CRAFT

A hands-on program inviting participants to explore the cultural significance of weaving within Aboriginal traditions.



THE EXPERIENCE

Join Nikki Browne for a hands-on weaving/rope making workshop designed for your students: rope / necklaces for grades F-4 and bracelets for grades 4-7. Weaving for older year levels.

This engaging program will explore the cultural significance of weaving in Aboriginal traditions, allowing participants to gain a deeper understanding of its historical and spiritual importance. Guided by our educator, students will have the opportunity to create their own woven pieces using natural materials.

In addition to the creative experience, the workshop will also promote environmental awareness, highlighting sustainable practices in art-making and the importance of protecting our natural world.

Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Histories & Cultures cross-curriculum priorities: COUNTRY/PLACE: OI.3 CULTURE: OI.5 PEOPLE: OI.8

WE SUPPLY

Experienced First Nations weaver, pre-woven samples, instruction sheets, natural fibres and plastic needles.

WE NEED

Adequate space for participants to sit and construct.

Fee: \$550 + GST (per class, max. 50 minutes)









LEARN HOW TO PLAY DIDGERIDGO

Get your male students to learn how to play an iconic instrument unique to Aboriginal culture - the didgeridoo!



THE EXPERIENCE

Students learn about the traditional background of the didgeridoo in Aboriginal culture: its origin, how a didgeridoo is made, why only men play this instrument and in what context. This is followed by every student getting issued with a sanitised practice instrument and taught how to create the basic drone and sound variations (eg. animal sounds), applying a number of techniques.

We will then explain and demonstrate the concept of 'circular breathing', enabling the player to play uninterrupted for several minutes.

WE SUPPLY

A selection of authentic, handcrafted didgeridoos, large pull up banners with images illustrating aboriginal people making and playing didgeridoos, sanitised plastic didgeridoo for all students.

WE NEED

The classroom to be set up with chairs in a large circle and name tags for the students, if possible.

Fee: \$550 + GST (per class, max. 50 minutes)

INTRODUCTION TO CULTURE

Our introduction to teaching First Nations' culture content, is a funfilled experiential learning opportunity for teachers.

After many years teaching Aboriginal content in Victoria, informed by the feedback from teachers in service and Aboriginal elders, we have developed an effective introductory framework PD empowering teachers to feel confident teaching culture, increasing competency and inspiration.
